



## Background

In a partnership, **Egmont Royal Institute for International Relations** and the **Development Group** are organising a series of Symposiums and an International High Level Conference that are taking place in Brussels in 2013.

The intense discussions during the different events organised in 2012 (Expert Seminars and Conference) showed that many questions related to the EU Energy Transition require further in-depth debates and analysis. Therefore, the up-coming events are focussing on the multifaceted challenge of the European Energy Transition towards a low carbon economy, addressing the following key issues related to the transition:

**1<sup>st</sup> Symposium:** The completion of the energy internal market by 2014: feasible or illusory? (21<sup>st</sup> Feb. 2013)

**2<sup>nd</sup> Symposium:** What external dimension for the EU energy transition - Which role for fossil fuels? (16<sup>th</sup> April 2013)

**International High Level Conference:** Beyond the 2020 horizon: Moving towards a common EU energy policy by 2030 (10<sup>th</sup> June 2013)

**3<sup>rd</sup> Symposium:** How to finance the transition towards a low-carbon economy and the required energy infrastructures? (Oct. 2013)

**4<sup>th</sup> Symposium:** How to foster innovation in a fast changing energy landscape? (Dec. 2013)

Egmont and the Development Group aim at setting an intense debate at EU level bringing together the views of the industry and other energy stakeholders from Brussels and beyond with those of EU decision makers.
