TASKS

The trainee will participate in a research project on lifelong learning policies in EU countries and the role of the EU in this field. The aim of the project is to analyze the differences of the national adult training systems and to make some proposals for an EU strategy to improve the national policies for up-skilling / reskilling of the European labour force. The main tasks of the trainee will be: i) contributing to a literature review on the subject of the research project iii) analyzing statistics on the topic; iv) preparing interviews with experts and decision makers; v) participating in the organization of events on employment and social policies.
